WHAT TO SAY – SPECIFIC BEQUEST WORDING



If you would like to leave a bequest to Twenty10 incorporating GLCS NSW in your Will there are a few ways you can do so. You should discuss your options with a solicitor to see which option is best in your circumstances.

Below are some options for leaving a bequest to Twenty10 incorporating GLCS NSW and the wording your solicitor may wish to use:

(a) If you want to leave everything to Twenty10 incorporating GLCS NSW: I give and bequeath the whole of my estate to The Twenty-Ten Association Inc. ABN 14 925 105 160 of 45 Chippen Street, Chippendale NSW 2008 for its general purposes and declare that the receipt of the public offer at the time is sufficient discharge of my Executor's duty;

OR

(b) If you want to leave a sum of money to Twenty10 incorporating GLCS NSW: I give and bequeath the sum of \$[X] to The Twenty-Ten Association Inc. ABN 14 925 105 160 of 45 Chippen Street, Chippendale NSW 2008 for its general purposes and declare that the receipt of the public offer at the time is sufficient discharge of my Executor's duty;

OR

(c) If you want to give specific gifts to other people or organisations then leave the rest of your estate to Twenty10:

I give and bequeath the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to TheTwenty-Ten Association Inc. ABN 14 925 105 160 of 45 Chippen Street, Chippendale NSW 2008 for its general purposes and declare that the receipt of the public offer at the time is sufficient discharge of my Executor's duty;

OR

(d) If you want to give specific gifts to other people or organisations then divide the rest of your estate between Twenty10 and others:

I give and bequeath [X] per cent of the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal to The Twenty-Ten Association Inc. ABN 14 925 105 160 of 45 Chippen Street, Chippendale NSW 2008 for its general purposes and declare that the receipt of the public offer at the time is sufficient discharge of my Executor's duty.
